## Biographical Sketch: David B. Land

(5 August 2013)

David B. Land is a senior executive with broad management and consulting experience in the public and private sectors of the United States as well as twenty other countries. The primary focus of his international work has been in development planning (most especially in national and regional sectoral planning), institution building (development banks, ministries, extension services), and project identification and evaluation. Mr. Land has been the president and chief executive officer of one of the largest land based agribusiness operations in the United States and of a municipal solid waste management company serving thousands of residential and business customers. Throughout his career, Mr. Land has served on numerous public and non-profit boards and commissions which presently include the Madison Greenspace Commission, Madison-Morgan Historic Foundation, and the Montessori Academy of Naples.

Since 2005, Mr. Land has been heavily engaged in the development of the food and agriculture sector in former Soviet Georgia and more recently in Abkhazia. For USAID, this has included leading a team in the preparation of a ten year national food and agriculture strategy with a proposed \$1.2 billion budget, and conducting a study for mandarin consolidation in Ajara, apple packing near Gori, and onion storage in the Marneuli-Bolnisi region. He has worked extensively with UNDP on a range of projects:

- Review and analysis of the draft 2012-2022 Georgian National Food and Agriculture Strategy with recommendations;
- Participation in the research and preparation of "Diversification and Development in the Kakheti Food and Agriculture Sector" for UNDP as editor and contributor;
- Preparation and delivery of a policy paper that addressed the challenges facing Georgia's food and agriculture sector and how these might be more effectively addressed;
- Evaluation of UNDP's micro-credit and business development assistance initiative in Georgia and recommendations on how UNDP might better assist the food and agriculture sector; and
- Review of the Georgian AgREE system and how extension might be more effectively and cost efficiently be provided in the country through both public and private sector entities. This included a review of the UNDP supported VET project in Kakheti and its possible expansion more widely in Georgia.

As a result of this work, Mr. Land is considered one of the leading foreign experts on the food and agriculture sector in Georgia.

Other professional work, positions, or assignments include:

- Drafting of the UNDP portion of the ENPARD Armenia project for the development of producer groups and the development of value chains in partnership with UNIDO
- Assessment of the Liberian livestock sector and development of the structure for preparing a national livestock strategy
- Preparation of the second and third national five year agricultural development plans for the Sultanate of Oman with an investment and operating budget of nearly US\$300 million (Project Manager).

- Evaluation and design of a strategic food reserve for the five Gulf Cooperation Council members (Saudi Arabia, Oman, Kuwait, Qatar, Bahrain, United Arab Emirates) under a contract with the World Bank (Project Manager of a U.S.-British consortium).
- Preparation of sub-national agricultural development plans for Oman (Project Manager).
- Development of crop budgets and agricultural/food project feasibility studies in the Sultanate of Oman (Project Manager), Jordan (Team Member), Togo (Team Member), Sri Lanka (Team Member), and Iran (Study Manager).
- Assistance in upgrading service delivery capacities of governmental institutions (credit, extension) in Oman, Dominican Republic, and Ecuador. (Project Manager/Team Member).
- Development of a large, geographically diverse agribusiness operation with 20,000 acres of citrus and vegetables, 10,000 head of cattle, packinghouses, and nurseries (CEO).
- Development of a municipal waste management company that served both rural and urban areas, residential and commercial needs (CEO).
- Preparation of multi-sector, multi-service comprehensive plans for governments with populations of a few thousand to nearly one-quarter million with the process requiring considerable public and elected official input and involvement (Chair, Vice Chair, Member).
- Design and conduct of a course in military civic action in Liberia (Team Member).
- Design and conduct of university-level courses in management and development. Student base was primarily from the Middle East, Africa, and South America.
- Participation in a multiplicity of situations that required environmental assessments, regulatory review and development, and project design.
- Involvement in numerous initiatives addressing affordable housing for farmworkers and other lower income groups and participation in international trade negotiations as they might affect agriculture, labor, and the environment.

On a pro bono basis, Mr. Land is involved with a number of initiatives in Haiti focusing on economic development and education. With respect to the latter, he is senior advisor to the Haiti Education Initiative of the University of Pennsylvania Graduate School of Education. In that capacity, Mr. Land assisted in the design of a new public university, participated in governance reform of the sector, and provided guidance on implementation of the National Pact for Education, a \$4.3 billion five year strategy for reforming and expanding the Haitian education sector. He was involved in the design and delivery of a management training program for staff of the Ministry and assisted Quisqueya University in development of a new Center for Entrepreneurship and Innovation. In 2011 he was recognized for his work by the Haitian Professionals of Philadelphia with its 2011 Revolutionary Leadership Award. He also supports economic development initiatives on Ile-a-Vache on Haiti's southern coast.

Mr. Land has a Bachelor of Arts in Development Studies (Economics, Political Science, Sociology) from New College and a Master of Agricultural Management and Resource Development from the University of Florida. He served nearly six years in the United States Army (active duty, Florida National Guard), was a platoon leader, executive officer, and company commander in Vietnam, was wounded, and awarded the Silver Star and Bronze Star for valor.

## Biographical Addendum: David B. Land (24 February 2012)

In addition to his broad management and consulting experience in the public and private sectors within the U.S. and abroad, Mr. Land has also had extensive involvement in the educational, environmental, and non-profit fields. Related work, positions, and involvements include:

- Assists the University of Pennsylvania Graduate School of Education (PennGSE) in its work with the Haitian Ministry of Education in the planning, oversight, and evaluation of the implementation of the National Pact for Education, a \$4.3 billion dollar five year initiative to reform, expand, and rebuild the Haitian national education system. This includes work in higher education, professional development and training, governance, and capacity building of the Ministry as well as the development of a new institute to conduct research on and evaluation of the education sector. Represent PennGSE and participate in panels at various conferences on education and economic development in Haiti.
- Professor of agribusiness management for ten years in the fully accredited master of management program of the Arthur D. Little Management Education Institute; member of various faculty committees; organizer and leader of graduate student field trips to New York, Washington, Florida, Chicago, and California to meet with such institutions as the UNDP, World Bank, USAID, OPIC, and IMF as well as with major corporations and banks (e.g., Chase Manhattan, Bechtel, Union Carbide, Dole, Sunkist, Chicago Board of Trade); arranged student internship/class projects with various local agribusinesses. The student body of this masters program was drawn primarily from the Middle East, Africa, and South America.
- Assisted in the development and taught components of various management education courses offered by the ADL Management Education Institute. Attendees were primarily from the Middle East, South America, and Africa.
- Taught undergraduate course in agricultural development at Tufts University as guest professor.

Additionally, he worked with staff to begin development of an integrated development assistance strategy for defined geographic areas which will be sustainable over the longer term.
